SPORT SPOTLIGHT:

ADAPTIVE SWIMMING

Jumping from 8 to 18 team-members this past year, the Portland Piranhas swim team is currently ASNW's fastest growing sport.

The team welcomes athletes of all Paralympic classifications, teaching those just learning to swim for the first time alongside future Paralympians.

Team Member **Adin Williams** was selected to represent Team USA's U-23 team in Athlone, Ireland. Williams won a gold medal in the 50-meter freestyle and a silver medal in the 50-meter butterfly.

The U-23 swim team that competed in Ireland was led by Adaptive Sports Northwest's swimming head coach, Meaghan Conway.

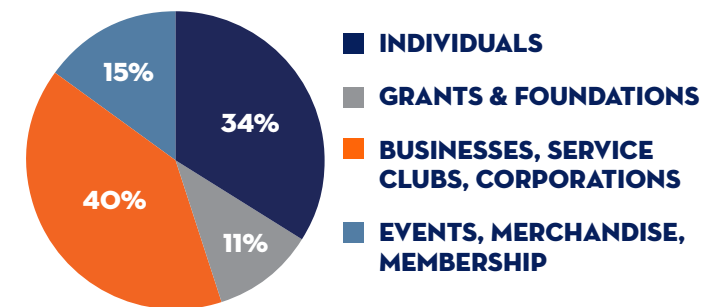

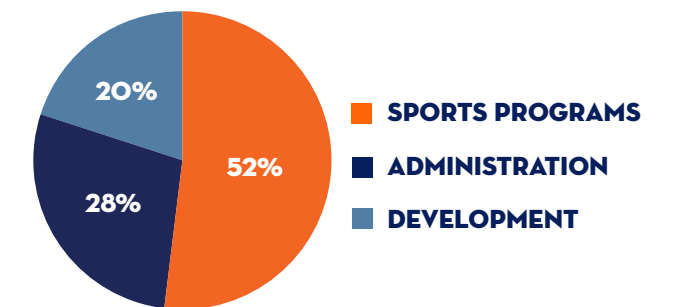
